Jeannie has been singing professionally for over 25 years. She has made more than 40 broadcasts and recordings for ABC Radio, including live recital broadcasts for ABC FM. She performed extensively with Victoria State Opera (roles include Madame Larina in Eugene Onegin, and Third Lady in The Magic Flute), and was part of their Young Artist program. For Chamber Made Opera, Jeannie has performed in The Heiress, The Cars that ate Paris, Lacuna, Improvement: Don leaves Linda, Tresno, and The Burrow. Jeannie has performed in many premieres of new music-theatre works, including Love Burns (Seymour Group, Adelaide Festival), *Little City, Teatro* (Melbourne Festival), and *1975* by Irine Vela; in major 20th-century repertoire (Theodorakis, Berio, Tippett, Janacek) in the international festivals of Sydney, Melbourne, and Brisbane; and in Barry Kosky's Voice/jam/videotape project at the 1998 Adelaide Festival. She has toured Japan with Theatreworks' The Last Supper, sung in two seasons of new operas in The Garden Project of the Royal Opera House Covent Garden (UK), toured Vietnam and Eastern Europe with Eureka Ensemble and New Music Liberation Front, toured country Victoria with cabaret programs, performed as oratorio and concert soloist with Melbourne Symphony Orchestra, Victoria State Orchestra, Musica Viva, and Melbourne Chorale, sang in three Huntingdon Festivals with Geoffrey Tozer, and performed in Melbourne Theatre Company's smash-hit production of Sondheim's A Little Night Music. Jeannie produced her first CD Madrugada with Ken Murray in 1999, which received critical acclaim in 24 Hours ABC magazine. In 2002 she launched Dry Martinis Latin jazz duo (bossa novas, Dean Martin, Brazilian pop), with Ken Murray, performing for Musica Viva at their Domaine Chandon Festival, on ABC radio, and in a season at 45 Downstairs. Since 2011 Jeannie has been a member of *Icon Trio*, co-creating and performing in *The Scots Haiku Project* (2013-2017) featuring Scottish poetry set to music by eleven Melbourne composers.
